

When your parents or grandparents were trick or treating did they ever have to think about their night being dangerous? The answer is most likely no, however in our current century it's becoming increasingly common. Candy poisoning/lacing is on the rise, specifically in the form of Fentanyl. This dangerous drug can cause an overdose with a very small amount, and the effects happen quickly. In recent years the death tolls have risen, and drug cartels are even trying to entice little kids into using these dangerous substances.

The effects of Fentanyl are terrifying to witness or experience. When it's taken in a dose that is not in excess, the effects are similar to many other drugs. It can cause euphoria, pain relief, sedation, etc; however, when taken in a dose of just two milligrams those effects can become disastrous. It leads to a state of stupor, cyanosis (bluish skin), comas, and sometimes respiratory failure, which results in death.

In addition, Fentanyl overdose deaths have risen significantly in the last decade. According to the National Institute on Drug Abuse the deaths went from a little under 40,000 in 2012, to being at almost 110,000 in 2022. In ten years it rose by almost 175%. The reason for this rise is fentanyl from Mexico being smuggled into the U.S.A. It is then mixed in with other drugs without the consumer knowing, or in some cases, it's presented as "Rainbow Fentanyl."

Rainbow Fentanyl is a colorful form of Fentanyl used by cartels in an attempt to entice children. It's sold in multiple forms, including pills, powders, and blocks. The Drug Enforcement Administration is advising the public to be wary of this trend. According to the DEA website, there has been Rainbow Fentanyl found in over 26 states since August 2022. Due to Rainbow Fentanyl being targeted towards children and young adults, trick or treaters or those celebrating Halloween in other ways should be cautious of this substance. There have been cases of this drug being placed in candy wrappers or containers and given out on Halloween in order to harm children.

Overall, Fentanyl overdoses have increased in the last decade, as well as the usage of rainbow fentanyl. To prevent this from ruining your Halloween, make sure to use common sense, and be cautious of your surroundings. The major thing, however, is to make sure to check your own or your little siblings' candy, to ensure your family's safety.


