# The Recent Election: New Wave of Politics by Mariah Marks

The 2024 presidential election has set the stage for unprecedented debates and controversies, driven by the candidacy and subsequent election of Donald Trump, whose criminal record includes 34 felony convictions. In an era where social media serves as a megaphone for public discourse, the election has sparked intense online debates about the future of America, its global representation, and the impact of constitutional norms—or lack thereof—on presidential eligibility.

Social Media: A Platform for Polarization

Since the election concluded on November 6, 2024, social media platforms have been inundated with contrasting perspectives on President-elect Trump's legal status and its implications. Public figures such as Cardi B have weighed in, amplifying the conversation and fueling the digital battleground where opposing views clash. Politico highlighted the unprecedented nature of the situation, noting, "For the first time in history, a presumptive presidential nominee from one of the two major U.S. political parties is a convicted felon."

While some users express outrage over Trump's ability to run for and win the presidency despite his criminal record, others defend his right to lead, emphasizing that his legal troubles should not overshadow his capacity to govern. This divide mirrors broader societal tensions, with Democrats questioning the fairness of his candidacy and Republicans pushing back against what they perceive as biased portrayals.

Legal Loopholes and Constitutional Questions
The debate centers around a glaring constitutional ambiguity: the U.S.
Constitution does not bar individuals with felony convictions from running for president. The only eligibility requirements are being at least 35 years old, a natural-born citizen, and having resided in the United States for at least 14 years. This has led to widespread confusion, with many questioning how a convicted felon can be legally unable to vote in some states but still eligible to hold the highest office in the land.

The only way to change this would be through a constitutional amendment. However, as the White House website explains, passing an amendment requires a two-thirds majority in both houses of Congress or a constitutional convention called by two-thirds of the states. The amendment must then be ratified by three-fourths of state legislatures or state conventions. Given the current political landscape—with 30 states voting Republican and 20 Democrat in the 2024 election—achieving the necessary 38-state majority seems implausible.

An alternative route would involve passing legislation to prohibit felons from running for president. However, such a bill would face significant hurdles. A Republican-majority Congress is unlikely to bring it to the floor, and even if it did pass, it would almost certainly be vetoed by President Trump. Overriding a presidential veto would require a two-thirds majority in both the House and Senate, an outcome that appears highly unlikely in today's polarized political environment.

The cold winds and wet turf set the stage for a fierce playoff battle between Suffolk rivals King's Fork and Nansemond River on Friday night. In front of a roaring crowd of over 1,000 fans, the two teams squared off in a defensive stalemate that encapsulated the intensity of their rivalry.

#### First Quarter: Defensive Dominance

The game began with King's Fork kicking off to Nansemond River, who took possession at their own 40-yard line. Nansemond River's offense struggled to gain momentum against King's Fork's tenacious defense, led by #11 Joshua Pittman's early sack, which pushed the Warriors back to their own 28-yard line. A punt by Nansemond River gave the Bulldogs favorable field position at their own 37-yard line.

However, penalties plagued King's Fork, stalling their drive despite capitalizing on a key pass interference call. The Bulldogs found themselves facing a false start and eventually turned the ball over on downs at Nansemond River's 17-yard line.

Nansemond River attempted to seize the momentum, with #8 Taivon "Philly" Douglas connecting on a long pass to #5 Calvin Holloway, followed by a strong run from #4 Melvin Brown. Despite their efforts, the Warriors couldn't sustain the drive, punting the ball back to King's Fork as the first quarter ended scoreless.

#### Second Quarter: Opportunities Missed

Nansemond River's defense continued to stand tall, pinning King's Fork deep in their own territory early in the second quarter. After a crucial timeout by Nansemond River, the Bulldogs punted, giving the Warriors excellent field position at King's Fork's 22-yard line. Douglas once again showcased his arm with a deep pass to #16 Christian Jordan, setting up the Warriors at the 5-yard line. However, the Bulldogs' defense held firm, forcing a turnover on downs.

King's Fork looked to capitalize on the defensive stand with a steady drive led by #0 Nyshaun Lewis, who broke loose for a long run. The Bulldogs managed to march to Nansemond River's 45-yard line but ran out of time before halftime, leaving the score knotted at 0-0.

But King's Fork would not be denied. Satchell found Green for another touchdown, sealing the game with a 35-14 scoreline. A late forced fumble by the Bulldogs' defense extinguished any hopes of a Nansemond River comeback.
